

Guidelines for the elaboration of abstracts

Deadline for submission of abstracts: 1st June 2022

Abstracts can be sent in the same moment of registration for the congress, or later. It must be sent only by the author who will be the expositor of the work.

A maximum of two abstracts may be sent to the Congress per registration as expositor.

Each author may submit only one oral presentation as a speaker. The Scientific Committee may change the modality and section in which the work will be presented depending on the program and the availability of rooms for oral presentations, which will be notified sufficiently in advance.

Symposium abstracts will be sent only to the organizer of the symposium, who will collect all of them and send them to the Scientific Committee.

- *Abstract submission*

Abstracts will be evaluated by peers designated by the Scientific Committee. In case of needing to make modifications for its acceptance, the authors will have two weeks after the date of sending the revised abstract to send the corrected version for re-evaluation. Once the abstract of the work has been accepted, it cannot be further modified.

Accepted abstracts will be published in the Book of Abstracts of the XI Argentine and XII Latin American Congress of Entomology, which will be a special publication of the Entomological Society of Argentina (SEA), in digital format.

The authors must indicate the modality (oral session or poster) and the preferred thematic area for each presentation.

Thematic areas:

- 1- Biodiversity, Biogeography and Conservation
- 2- Ecology
- 3- Agricultural, Forest and Urban Entomology
- 4- Medical, Veterinary and Forensic Entomology
- 5- Evolution and Phylogeny
- 6- Physiology, Development and Behavior
- 7- Genetics and Genomics
- 8- Ecosystem Services, Pest Management and Insect Pathology
- 9- Systematics, Taxonomy and Morphology
- 10- Myrmecology (RAM)
- 11- Special topics

- *Abstract format.* Use the template available at the [Congress website](#)

- Abstracts must be prepared in a Word file (*.doc; *.docx), on A4 sheet, vertically, with margins of 2.5 cm. The full abstract (title, authors, affiliations and content) should not exceed 400 words and may be written in Spanish or English.

- The name of the file must begin with the thematic area number (number from 1 to 11), followed by the presenter's last name, underscore, the initials of his/her name, underscore, and the number 1 or 2, according to the number of works presented as first author. Example: 3García_LA_1.doc (Paper sent for thematic area 3, by García Luciano Aníbal, and it is abstract number 1)

-The abstract must contain:

Title (Arial 12, bold). It must be written in upper/lower case, centered, in a maximum of 2 lines. Titles that include generic or specific scientific names must not mention their authors; the order and the family to which they belong must appear separated by a colon and between parentheses. Scientific names should be in italics.

Example: Systematic revision of the genus *Barypus* (Coleoptera: Carabidae)

Authors (Arial 11, underlined the author who will present the work). The last name must be capitalized, followed by the first name and the middle initial after a comma.

Example: GÓMEZ, Pedro E.

GÓMEZ, Pedro E. & GONZÁLEZ, María M.

GÓMEZ, Pedro E., GONZÁLEZ, María M. & PÉREZ, Fernando

Affiliation (Arial 10). Indicate by means of superscripts the place of work of the authors, using consecutive numbers for different places of work. Include the electronic address of the expositor of the work.

Abstract body (Arial 11). In a single paragraph, left alignment, with single line spacing and no indents. In its development, the text must include: introduction, objectives, materials and methods, results and discussion/conclusions of the work.

The abstract should not contain subtitles, charts, tables, figures, or references. Avoid the use of unusual symbols and unnecessary abbreviations.

Note: Abstracts that do not follow the requested format will not be evaluated and will be returned for correction.
